



If you look at the lesson plan and "see question of the day" and wonder why we ask it, don't worry, your child isn't initially excited about answering our questions—we don't rush

them to answer or move on to another one too quickly. Letting your child take their time shows that we are genuinely interested in what they have to say, and not just robotically asking.



And for us adults, it's a great way to exercise our own creativity and imagination. We are modeling curiosity, discussion, listening and thinking skills.

We are also showing our children that we often have things in common, and sometimes have a difference of opinion, and that is good, too.



Show and Tell is every Friday! Help your child find something to show and tell about. Ask your child what they want to say about their item. This positive interaction builds confidence

and self-esteem. It gives them a chance to be the center of attention and to show off what they have to discuss, and, in turn, makes them feel good about themselves. Because this is a group activity, it helps teach children appropriate social skills.

During the month of January we learned so many new things and explored activities that focused on seasons (winter), measuring, weather climates, and health and cleanliness.

Our kiddos had a blast measuring each other to see who was the tallest, smallest, same height, and in-between. For measuring, we also learned how to bake a super chocolaty cake by following specific

measurements and ingredients. For our mathematical component children have been

graphing, measuring and counting using blocks and other items in our classroom.



Because this month was particularly our coldest, we thought it would be a great idea to incorporate a weather guy/girl for each day of the week. Children would sing our "What's the Weather" song and proceed to the window, viewing all of the visible climates outside. Learning about Fahrenheit vs.

Celsius was also part of their task. They loved being quizzed on when and where to use these degree measurements.

We all know cold weather brings on germs and colds. Let's keep those germs away by learning and practicing safe ways to stay clean and healthy. Children talked about the importance of washing their hands throughout the day so that



they wouldn't get their friends sick. They all named common places and things germs are usually found on to make us all aware.



We conducted a science project using a balloon, confetti, and a yellow blank piece of construction paper to see how far germs could actually travel. Placing the construction paper on the table.

blowing up two balloons and filling them with confetti, children were asked if they though the confetti would stay on the yellow paper or spread past the yellow paper when the balloons were popped (hypothesis). We then conducted our **experiment** by popping both balloons. Our **results** showed us that the germs spread off of our yellow paper even further that we thought. They loved this science experiment.

The class has also been working hard on practicing our reading skills and working on our homework.


This month we will continue to explore our STE(A)M skills through fun classroom projects and experiments.

After School Program—Girls (The Cheer Cheetahs)




The Cheers Cheetahs have announced BRING IT! to the chilly weather... and have been warming up with increased physical activity. In a heart smart move by Ms.
