



curriculum will focus on trees, nests, birds, eggs, rain, wind, Easter and caring about our planet.



Reading to your child builds strong literacy skills. From Reading Rockets here are a few concepts we adults know so well we forget sometimes we ever learned them.



- There's a difference between words and pictures. Point to the print as you read aloud.
- Words on a page have meaning, and that is what we learn to read.
- Words go across the page from left to right. Follow with your finger as you read.
- Words on a page are made up of letters and are separated by a space.
- Each letter has at least two forms: one for capital letters and one for small letters. (Bagert 1996)

One last thing from Reading Rockets:

"You May go through a period when your child favors one book and wants it read night after night. It is not unusual for children to favor a particular story, and this can be boring for parents. Keep in mind, however, that a favorite story may speak to your child's interests or emotional needs. Be patient. Continue to expose your children to a wealth of books and eventually they will be read for more stories." (Bagert 1996)

Hooray! Spring has sprung! March brought excellent weather. We've been to the park, library, and even a


nature walk to collect trash in our neighborhood during the "Clean Sweep" unit. It was nice to see the children's eagerness to help clean up and recycle.




Wow, hello Spring!


Upcoming during the month of April:
